
Protecting People and Planet from Pesticides







What are pesticides?

- Pesticides are poisons designed to kill living organisms
- Insecticides, herbicides, fungicides, molluscicides etc.
- Used everywhere, not just in agriculture
- Don't just limit themselves to target organisms





What do pesticides do?

- 1-3% of agricultural workers (>10 million) poisoned each year
- >300,000 deaths annually (>850 per day)
- Chronic ill health on the rise particularly in children
 - ADHD, autism, lower IQ, cancers, birth defects, early puberty, obesity, diabetes, asthma

What do pesticides do?

- Large-scale, long-term decline in wild bees across England
- UK farmland birds have declined by 48% since 1970
- UK butterflies worst hit in 2016 with 70% of species in decline
- Insect abundance has fallen by 75% over the last 27 years
- 66% decline in hedgehog numbers over past 13 years
- 68% decline in common toad populations in past 30 years
- Millions of £ spent on removing pesticides from water

Pesticide use in our towns

- Every year hundreds of tonnes of toxic pesticides are used in UK towns
- The most commonly used are glyphosate and 2,4-D, both are suspected of being carcinogenic
- There is no reason to use pesticides in our towns
- The only thing we grow in our towns and cities is our children
